FACILITIES COMMITTEE UPDATE



Like many of our homes around the neighborhood the Clubhouse will soon be getting a new roof. Our insurance company has approved full replacement and we are in the process of selecting a roofing company. There are also issues with the fence surrounding the playground and we are contracting with a fencing company to make the necessary repairs.

New blinds have been installed in the clubhouse thanks to some handy volunteers. The blinds will help reduce heat issues that effect summer rentals and protect the carpet and furniture from fading. The blinds will also allow renters privacy from activities on and around the pool deck.

From inside the pool you may have noticed a stain around the pool liner. This is believed to be caused by rust originating in the surge system. The chemicals necessary to remove this stain would require closing of the pool for a minimum of two days. The facilities committee has made arrangements with the pool management company to clean the stain after the pool is closed for the season.

Get Involved in the Neighborhood Watch Program



The CNA Board is in the early stages of developing a Neighborhood Watch Program. We have already received a positive response from several of you volunteering your time, experiences and wisdom to this effort! While Copperfield is already a very safe neighborhood with very few crimes occurring each year, we believe we can make it even safer! The first step in this process will be to have a meeting at which the local police department will discuss the different components of a neighborhood watch program. As we work to kick off this program there are a number of things that everyone can do to keep Copperfield safe.

- Look out for your neighbors. If you see something suspicious, ask questions.
- If you see kids out on our streets after reasonable hours, ask what they are doing.
- If you see anything that resembles vandalism, call the police.

**Do Your Street Trees
Need Trimming?**

This is a reminder that you need to be mindful of the trees on your property. Please keep all street trees properly pruned so that they do not interfere with street or sidewalk traffic. In addition, make sure that your trees are not blocking any street signs or stop signs. This can create dangerous situations.

Here are the guidelines from the LFUCG Code of Ordinances.

- Minimum clearance over sidewalks is 7 feet
- Minimum clearance over streets is 12 feet
- Proper care of the street trees is the responsibility of the homeowner.

This year's title marks the swim team's third championship.

Previously, the team took top honors in 2000 and 2001.

Since joining MOWSC in 1995, the Crocs have always been ranked in the top four.

Of 60 possible MOWSC records, Copperfield holds 13.

Along with their 2007 Championship, the Crocs took home 73 total individual and team medals:

Gold-18, Silver-9, Bronze-12, 4th-13, 5th-13, 6th-8.
